Background to the event:

How the Event will work:

Speed dating: Every local area has to develop a Children and Young People's Transformation Plan (LTP) to set out how local services will invest resources to improve children and young people's mental health. Steering Group: The Northern England Clinical Networks is responsible for bringing together organisations across North Cumbria and the North East, to help them work better together for children and young people's mental health. This work is discussed every 2 months at their Children and Young People's Mental Health and Wellbeing Steering Group. **2-4pm, Monday the 24th Sept, Newcastle**

Workshop: Every 6 months, there is a one-day workshop across North Cumbria and the North East that is held to discuss how mental health services can be better integrated with social care services. There will be time throughout the day for people interested in young people's mental health to think about this topic. **9am-5pm, Tuesday the 30th Oct, Durham**

Co-production: Working with YoungMinds, we are looking for young people and parents/carers to help us better communicate the work we do at the Northern England Clinical Networks.
