Peterlee Urgent Treatment Centre



Important changes to opening hours:



From Sunday January 5th 2020, Peterlee Urgent Treatment Centre will close from **midnight to 8am every day**.

During this time, you will **no longer** be able to walk into the centre for treatment.

Peterlee Urgent Treatment Centre will re-open daily between 8am and midnight.

Care will still be available **locally** between midnight and 8am by calling NHS 111



Conditions that can be treated at any urgent treatment centre include:

- Cuts and grazes
- Sprains and strains
- Simple broken bones
- Wounds and wound infections
- Minor burns and scalds
- Minor head injuries
- Insect and animal bites
- Minor back injuries
- Skin infections / rashes / allergic reactions
- Urine infections
- Raised temperature/fever
- Minor eye injuries (foreign bodies in eye)
- Emergency contraception
- Abdominal pain
- Vomiting and diarrhoea
- Ear and throat infections
